

A Message from Father Scott VanDerveer, Pastor at St. Mary's Church God First. Loving Others. Making Disciples

Dear Parish Family,

Part of our commitment to excellence at our parish is to take time to consider the most effective way to accomplish our goals and then find a way to do that as inexpensively as possible. A good example of that is the food we're providing for our teens and tweens at our Sunday Night Faith Formation program featuring *The Chosen* and small groups.

We asked ourselves: *what would cause these kids to feel appreciated and taken care of? What would be a way to show that we intend for this to be fun – that learning more about God and about the path of Jesus is joyful, not boring or a burden?* And the answer appeared: Feed them! After all, they're hungry at 6 PM (although, at that age, they are ALWAYS hungry), so why not plan to serve pizza and feed them?

Since we're having "watch parties" for *The Chosen*, in the vintage SMA Little Theater, we need to offer the full theater experience with fresh popcorn, Junior Mints and Mike & Ike's. At first, this idea seemed extravagant, but in crunching the numbers, we found a pizza place that, knowing our goal, would discount the price. We found the most affordable source for buying the candy and a parishioner donated a commercial popcorn machine.

The result? The kids LOVED the pizza and real movie theater experience! Parents felt pampered with the responsibility for dinner lifted off their shoulders – and all this generated goodwill for our families will cost us a few thousand dollars a year.

Our staff and volunteers are the key to our success at St. Mary's. One thing that makes us different from every other Catholic church we know is that we have no parish secretary. Imagine that! When our longtime, beloved secretary Robin retired in 2021, we at first felt compelled to scramble for a replacement, but we soon realized that was not the best solution.

Instead, we hired Alison, our part-time Volunteer Coordinator, and she coordinates a team of volunteer receptionists who handle all of our front office tasks with commitment and excellence. No one who comes to St. Mary's or calls on the phone would ever dream that the person handling all those tasks is an unpaid volunteer. Because we no longer employ a full-time secretary, we now are able to have a Business & Operations Manager, Gary, who oversees the financial and facilities needs of our parish and the campus of our school and two cemeteries with the drive and vision of a longtime entrepreneur. Having Gary means we no longer need to employ a separate Cemetery Manager and our bookkeeping position, which was once full-time, is now just a 10-hour position, which Charlie, a retired CPA and SMA grad does expertly.

Melissa came on board two years ago to assist Fr. Tom with meeting people's more involved pastoral needs and in time at St. Mary's, she's handled countless issues in every department and arena of parish and school life. We've come to realize that her skills and experience allow her to fill any number of roles, so she adapts her role to meet the most pressing need at any given time with the can-do attitude and hard work that's her trademark. Right now, she's saving us the cost of a full-time Faith Formation Coordinator by launching our dynamic new youth programs.

Talent attracts talent, so having a team this wonderful means that whenever we have an opening, we get people like Ben, our music director, an SMSA alumnus with a music composition degree from NYU... and Emily, our communications director, who also works for the Diocese and has experience working at WRGB and WTEN.

Churches usually struggle to offer decent compensation to their employees, but because of your generosity, and the commitment of our true blue volunteers, St. Mary's is able to pay a living wage to our staff. My priest friends often marvel enviously of what we are able to do at St. Mary's with the staff and volunteers we have. And I always tell them it's because of the people of this parish – the generous parishioners who allow us to dream big then and make those dreams realities, because of your tireless support, in good times and in bad.

Thank you – one and all – for the way you demonstrate your love and commitment to our church by the generosity of your giving to the mission of St. Mary's.


