

Father Scott's Sharing Spot

A Message from Father Scott VanDerveer, Pastor at St. Mary's Church



Dear Parish Family,

In our continuing series on the Four Pillars of Catholic Social Teaching, we now come to a lesser-known but vitally important principle: **subsidiarity.** The word may be unfamiliar, but the concept is deeply intuitive—and profoundly Catholic.

The principle of subsidiarity holds that decisions should be made at the most local, competent level possible. It's a way of organizing society that respects the dignity of each person by empowering families, communities, and institutions to take responsibility for their own lives. It encourages larger organizations—whether governments, corporations, or even churches—not to take over what individuals and local groups can do for themselves.

Why is this so important? Because it respects human dignity. Subsidiarity says: You are capable. You are needed. You have a voice. Whether it's a parent guiding their child, a neighborhood organizing for safety, or a parish planning its ministries—those closest to the situation are usually best equipped to understand it and respond wisely.

When subsidiarity is ignored, people feel powerless. But when it's embraced, people are energized and engaged. That's why we encourage lay leadership in our committees and ministries. It's why we trust parents to be the first teachers of their children. And it's why we listen to the lived experiences of those affected by poverty, illness, or discrimination—instead of assuming others know best.

But subsidiarity isn't about individualism. It doesn't mean "everyone for themselves." In fact, it needs to be balanced by the principle of solidarity—the idea that we belong to one another and must support each other, especially the weak and vulnerable. Without solid arity, subsidiarity can devolve into neglect. But without subsidiarity, solidarity can become smothering and impersonal.

So, how can we live subsidiarity in our daily lives?

- Encourage your children or grandchildren to take ownership of their responsibilities.
- Participate in local government and civic meetings and town halls.
- Listen to the insights of those closest to the issues—even when their perspective differs from your own.
- At St. Mary's, consider joining or proposing a ministry that responds to a real need you see in our community.

This week, ask yourself: Am I giving others the freedom and trust to act? Am I stepping up when I have the gifts to help? When subsidiarity is lived well, it builds confident individuals and strong communities, all rooted in human dignity.

Next week, we'll explore the final pillar: solidarity—the virtue that binds us together as one human family and reminds us that we're never alone in our struggles.



ParishSOFT Online Giving Upgrade September 23, 2025.


Your account and payment information will transfer securely — no need to create a new account or re-enter your details.

School is Back in Session!


We wish everyone a wonderful year back at school! There are a few new faces this year for teachers and staff and we are excited for them to be joining us this year!
