

A Message from Father Scott VanDerveer, Pastor at St. Mary's Church

Dear Parish Family,

It's rare for the feast of Saints Peter and Paul to fall on a weekend, and I believe in my 12 years of priesthood, I've never before had the opportunity to preach to a weekend congregation about these two incredible saints. Because of that, when I looked through the files I've kept over the years of tidbits about Peter and Paul, I realized I had far too much to be able to put into one weekend homily. So here are a couple of reflections – one for Peter one for Paul – that I thought you might find interesting.

This first one is from the marvelous Episcopal priest and author Rev. Barbara Brown Taylor from her book The Seeds of Heaven. She reminds us that Jesus' statement to his followers: "It was not you who chose me but I who chose you," applies to all of us in every situation, even when we feel grossly inadequate.

"It is nothing that Peter is or says or does all by himself that wins him the keys to the kingdom. He is blessed because his answer is God's answer, and he is a rock because he is a chunk off the Rock of Ages, and it is on this relationship that the church is built, not on any virtue of Peter's—or yours, or mine. Peter is chosen, but not because the right answer has occurred to him. On the contrary, the right answer has occurred to him because he is chosen, because Jesus is his unsearchable wisdom, his inscrutable way, decided to pick a bullheaded, bighearted, fallible, stubborn, never-say-die rock upon which to build his church."

Florence Morgan Gillman PhD, STD, is professor of biblical studies at the University of San Diego. An expert on St. Paul, she is the author of many scholarly articles and wrote a book called Women Who Knew Paul. That list of women included an influential royal figure named Bernice. Professor Gilman reflects on Paul's poverty and weakness in comparison with Bernice's regal stature.

"Bernice was a member of the Jewish Herodian royal family and (is a figure who) appears briefly in Acts 25. Bernice had power over Paul and was one of those who decided that he should be callously sent as a prisoner to Rome. The irony however, is that in the Acts narrative about Paul, written only some decades later, Bernice is so briefly mentioned, even so unimportant, as to become almost a footnote in his life. This fascinating reversal, such an inversion of who seems to be important or who seemed of no consequence during their lives, causes one to ponder appearances and the directions we choose for ourselves in our brief existences. As the biblical scholar T. R. Glover comments: The day was to come when people would name their dogs Nero and their sons Paul."

I highly recommend both of these authors to anyone who wants to dive more deeply into study of the Bible. Where would we be without those who follow the call to study scripture and learn about the faith so that they can teach the rest of us so effectively?
