Dear Parish Family,

In our fast-moving world filled with noise, screens, and constant activity, solitude can seem like a luxury—or even a strange concept. But it is, in fact, a gift from God and a necessary part of a healthy spiritual and emotional life.

I will be taking my annual retreat in July this year. As I sometimes have in the past, I will be spending a week in silence at a Camoldolese Monastery. Many people who know me comment that a person as outgoing and social as I am must have a terrible time entering silence. But as much as I love people, I find that solitude nourishes me in a way that few other things can.

Author Raymond Kethledge defines solitude as "freedom from inputs from other minds." That means true solitude isn't simply being alone. It's about being present in quiet, without distractions, even the ones we invite—like a podcast playing during a walk in the Woods.

Modern research confirms what the Christian tradition has always taught: solitude is good for the soul. Consider the many ways it can bless us:

- Solitude deepens empathy. When we withdraw from constant interaction, we often return with greater compassion for others—especially those outside our usual circles.
- **Solitude increases productivity**. Quiet space allows us to concentrate more fully and work more effectively.
- **Solitude sparks creativity.** When we're alone with our thoughts, our minds are free to explore, imagine, and create.
- **Solitude builds resilience**. Studies show that those who spend time alone experience greater happiness, improved stress management, and stronger emotional health.
- Solitude helps us reflect. In quiet moments, we can examine our lives, our direction, and our spiritual path.
- **Solitude fosters self-knowledge.** Free from the noise of others' opinions, we can listen for what truly matters in our own hearts.

Whether it's turning off the car radio, sitting quietly in your home, or taking a walk without your phone, I encourage you to make time for moments of true solitude.

The poet Rainer Maria Rilke once wrote, "Our task is to listen to the news that is always arriving out of silence." May we each find space to listen well.
