# Welcome to Mass at St. Mary's Church

Things to know...

<u>Bathrooms</u>: There are two single toilet bathrooms in the church building; one in the main entrance and one in the Meeting Room (next to the front left entrance door). There is a baby changing station in the main entrance bathroom.


<u>Welcome Desk</u>: Located at the rear of the church, the Welcome Desk is where you can get more information about our parish, acquire a welcome packet, request Mass intentions, get information on becoming Catholic, etc. Most anything that you can do at the church office during the week, you can do at the Welcome Desk. The Welcome Desk is staffed by volunteers after every weekend Mass.

<u>Babies / Toddlers</u>: We love having very young children here at St. Mary's and we know that at times they can become inconsolable during Mass. If you ever feel the need to take your child away from the congregation, you are welcome to use our Meeting Room (next to the front left entrance door). The Mass is being streamed to a TV in that room. When your child is soothed, please come back and join the assembly in the church.

**Faith Finders:** Every Sunday, all children in pre-k through grade 4 are invited to come forward when Faith Finders are called after the opening songs and prayers. Those who wish to attend will go with the leaders to the Faith Finders room where they will have a kid friendly lesson. The children return to join their families in church in time for Communion.

<u>Singing at St. Mary's</u>: We are a parish who loves to sing at Mass! In this worship aid you will find the lyrics and music - please join in; St. Augustine said, *"those who sing pray twice."* 

<u>Communion</u>: All are welcome to join in the Communion procession during Mass. If you are not Catholic or if for any other reason receiving Communion is not right for you today, please cross your arms in front of your chest to receive a blessing instead of a host. Ultra-low gluten hosts are available by joining the priest's line. If you do not want to join the Communion procession, that is okay - please just step into the aisle so the folks sitting next to you can get out and then you can return to your seat to pray.

#### **READINGS:**

Reading I Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14

God sets a father in honor over his children; a mother's authority he confirms over her sons. Whoever honors his father atones for sins, and preserves himself from them. When he prays, he is heard; he stores up riches who reveres his mother. Whoever honors his father is gladdened by children, and, when he prays, is heard. Whoever reveres his father will live a long life; he who obeys his father brings comfort to his mother. My son, take care of your father when he is old; grieve him not as long as he lives. Even if his mind fail, be considerate of him; revile him not all the days of his life; kindness to a father will not be forgotten, firmly planted against the debt of your sins —a house raised in justice to you.

Reading II Colossians 3:12-17

Brothers and sisters: Put on, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another, if one has a grievance against another; as the Lord has forgiven you, so must you also do. And over all these put on love, that is, the bond of perfection. And let the peace of Christ control your hearts, the peace into which you were also called in one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, as in all wisdom you teach and admonish one another, singing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, in word or in deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

Gospel Luke 2:22, 39-40

When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, they took him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord. When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him.
