A Message from Father Scott VanDerveer, Pastor at St. Mary's Church



Dear Parish Family,

Andy Rooney was a long-time commentator on CBS-TV's 60 Minutes. Many of us appreciated his witty (if sometimes whiney) take on life. Did you know that he grew up in Albany and always maintained roots here? In fact, though his work required him to live in NYC, his residence was not far from Thatcher Park in Rensselaerville, just a few hills and dales south of the Thruway.

Near the end of his life, he shared some things he'd learned from years of living. Here's an excerpt of his wise list...

l've learned...

The best classroom in the world is at the feet of an elderly person.

That just one person saying to me, "You've made my day" makes my day.

That being kind is more important than being right.

That you should never say no to a gift from a child.

That I can pray for someone when I don't have the strength to help him in any other way.

That sometimes all a person needs is a hand to hold and a heart to understand.

That love, not time, heals all wounds. That I could have told my Mom that I love her more times before she passed away.

That one should keep their words both soft and tender, because tomorrow they may have to eat them.

That when you're in love, it shows. That having a child fall asleep in your arms is one of the most peaceful feelings in the world.

That no matter how serious your life requires you to be, everyone needs a friend to act goofy with.

That it's those small daily happenings that makes life so spectacular.

What have you learned so far in life? With whom can you share it?

The SMSA Advantage


